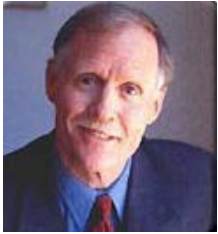

His enthusiasm for developing more effective teams and individual performance stem from his unique perspective of leading major expeditions on five continents and as a guide and corporation president.

He offers professional development training for corporations in the areas of team development, strategic planning, communication, conflict/resolution, coaching and creative leadership.

Roy was a mountain and safari guide in East Africa taking groups to the summits of Kilimanjaro, Mt. Kenya and the Mountains of the Moon.



In 1966, as a member of British team, he made the ascent of the North Ridge of Alpamayo, the last unclimbed 20,000' mountain in the Andes. A year later he led a team that made the first crossing of the Sea of Cortez in kayaks. In 1976 led a National

Geographic supported expedition, which made the first winter crossing of the Alaska Brooks Range – a 400 mile, forty-day journey on skis pulling sleds from the Arctic Circle to Umiat on the North Slope. He has led groups to the summit of Chimborazo, 20,700' in Ecuador, to the summit of Mt. McKinley, 20,220' in Alaska and rafted down the headwater regions of the

Amazon River. While undertaking post-graduate studies at the School of Forestry at Yale University, he organized and led a major **National Geographic exploratory and scientific expedition down the 600-mile Omo River in Ethiopia. In 2005 he crewed on a 44' catamaran around Cape Horn.**



For four years he was a **consultant for the W. K. Kellogg Foundation** working in the United States and East Africa. He developed leadership-training programs for its National Fellows Program. He has **lectured at the National Geographic in Washington DC, in**

the IBM Distinguished Lecturer Series, at universities in the United States, England, and Canada and for major corporations.

Roy is the executive producer of a one hour documentary, **"Leadership on the Edge"** shown on Public Television in April and May 2009

Roy's graduate work at Yale University's School of Management convinced him that the lessons of leadership, building winning teams, and risk taking learned in an adventure setting, were highly relevant and applicable to the corporate world.

His experiences of working with people striving for extraordinary goals, often under exacting and life threatening circumstances- have given him remarkable insights into leadership and what it takes to motivate and produce the winning team.
